From Your Pastor

In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, asking, "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage."

—Matthew 2:1

As we turn the page on another year, we in the church are not yet done with the Christmas story. Aside from the fact that we are never finished with God's in-breaking in the world, our remembrance of Christ's birth isn't complete until we have woven his story - our story - with that of the strangers.

Whenever we come to Epiphany, remembering the Magi from the East who were neither Christian, nor Jew and yet recognized the signs of Christ's coming and heard the voice of God upon their departure, I can't help but wonder which strangers God might be weaving into our sacred stories today.

I spend the vast majority of my time thinking about the people and ministries of Gretna United Methodist Church. I think about how I can serve you all and, with you, serve the community to which God has called us. I do not spend enough time thinking about where God is already at work in the community around us. I certainly don't spend enough time thinking about who and what beyond the walls of our church God might be using to teach us how to be more faithful to who we are called to be.

And so, because we are not yet finished with the Christmas story and, more importantly, because the Christmas story is not yet finished with us, I am asking you to join me in reflecting on these questions.

Specifically here at Gretna United Methodist Church we have identified four ways in which we engage the work of God, through:

Meaningful Service; Inspiring Worship; Genuine Connection, and; Christ Centered Education and Activities.

So I ask you, who in Gretna and the surrounding areas has their fingers on the pulse of service that is really transforming lives? Who is engaged in deeply spiritual practice? Who is working to build genuine connection? Who is teaching the Gospel in compelling ways?

These do not have to be explicitly Christian people or organizations for us to learn from them (remember the Magi?). The ability to see Christ in the midst of their work and infuse Christ into whatever it is we take away from our encounters with them is what we already bring to the table.

So let's draw the circle wide, think outside the box, and see how, together, we might grow in new ways in the coming year!
